FIELD TRIP MUST KNOW INFO

The field trips are sponsored by the Quartzsite Roadrunner Gem & Mineral Club. Any questions you have that aren't answered here can be answered by club members at their Pow Wow booths numbered 422, 423 and 442.

There are two daily trips, each to a different location. There is a \$2.00 temporary membership charge for non-members to go on field trips. Please bring the supplies you will need for rockhounding as the club does not provide them for you. You will want to take a bucket, rock hammer, water and anything else that you may want. It is also a wise idea to take food and a first aid kit.

The trips leave promptly at 9:00 am. You will want to be early to sign in with the wagon master and see samples of what you will be looking for upon arrival at the hunt destination. Pets are allowed on the trip but you must have them under control at all times. Keep in mind that there are many hazards for animals in the desert.

The BLM regulates the amount of rock that a person can remove from the site. Daily limit is 25 lbs. per site. Yearly limit is 250 lbs. Please be respectful of these regulations.

It is your responsibility to remove all trash that you generate.

Departure Meeting Location

East: From the stop light on Hwy 95 South & E. Kuehn St. (south side of hwy 95 overpass) go east on E. Kuehn St. for .9 miles to the intersection of E. Kuehn St. & Riggles Ave. (Riggles Ave. is I-10 Exit 19 crossover south end) Line up on the north east corner on E. Kuehn St.

North: Hwy 95 North (Central Blvd.) go I.5 mi. to Tyson Road, then East 1/4 mi. Park on the north side of the road facing west.

South: Hwy 95 South and Kuehn St., (south side of hwy 95 overpass) go south 1 mile to Mile Post 103. Park on the right (west) side of the road.

West: From the stop light at Hwy. 95 & Kuehn St. (south side of I-10), go 2.1 miles to just east of the Super 8 Motel and park on the north side of the road. From the Love's Station it is .6 miles. (Exit 17 on I-10)
